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How to promote european and international mobility of students with special needs?

Students with disabilities participate too little in European (such as Erasmus) and international exchange programs: for example, in France, only 11 students with disabilities in 2009-2010 went through an Erasmus (on 10 500 students with disabilities in total in Higher Education en France)

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This working group will present an overview as regards the situation in the French higher education and an opportunity to interact to determine what is the situation in this field in other countries: what works correctly, what are the main points that are a hindrance, the difficulties to the mobility of students with disabilities?

The objective of this interactive workshop is to find the levers that will help our students but also that will facilitate each university to accommodate students with disabilities better.

The idea for later continuation, is to rely on the network and the group FEDORA "Inclusion" to work on this issue by restarting the work that has already been done: update the Guide needs and the countries information sheets / institutions (to know the policy of admitting students with disabilities in each country, methods and teaching materials available, new technologies, specific grants, accommodation, etc.) to encourage our students to enroll in exchange programs.
